Applications for the Rhodes Scholarship must be made by the undersigned not later than Monday, the 1st July next.
The selection will probably be completed by July 15th.
Candidates must have passed their twenty-fifth birthday on the 1st of October of the year for which they are elected.
The value of the Scholarship is £250 a year for three years.
Candidates must send an application form, a birth certificate, and a statement of the examinations passed, the degrees (if any) taken.
A statement by applicant as to the general interests and academic line of study which he proposes to follow at Oxford, and the character of the work at which he aims in after years.
Testimonials from not more than four persons.
References to four persons, under at least two of whom he has studied.
His name, address and occupation.
A statement of war service (if any).
Typed copies with the originals of the above to be supplied.
Applications must be sent into the Rhodes Office, 1923.

Failing Eavesdroppers.

A startling discovery was once made by British post office engineers. It was that every message sent over a certain telegraph wire connected with the Stock Exchange could be tapped by the user of an adjacent telephone line provided he understood the Morse alphabet.

In this way, it was believed, some rascals had obtained information which had turned to good account. Similar "leakages" brought about by accident or design, are not uncommon. When a telephone operator pushes back a certain key on his switchboard, she can listen to every word that passes between sender and receiver.

For a perfectly legitimate reason, a telephone operator one morning pushed back this key, and overheard two people whom she knew make an appointment. A day or two later she mentioned this fact quite innocently to a third party, with the result that there was a sensational divorce suit.

In another case the sub-editor of an evening newspaper, while at the telephone, heard the proprietor of a local morning paper sending to his office particulars of a serious accident which he had just witnessed. Jotting down the details, the eavesdropper "wrote up" the occurrence, and less than an hour afterwards papers containing an account of the disaster were on sale.

Mr. Lloyd George, when at the Peace Conference in Paris, was for a time victimized in a similar manner. After communicating with London by telephone he discovered that the line had been "tapped." This was awkward; but he was equal to the occasion. A Welshman was installed at the London end of the wire, and subsequent conversations were carried on in Welsh.

The wrong delivery of telegrams is another prolific cause of "leakages." A manufacturer sent to an agent in Scotland a "wire" concerning certain goods, addressing it "Macduff, Haggisville." The agent's customer was also named Macduff, and as he was the most prominent man in Haggisville, the telegram was delivered to him. That did it. Away went the agent's most cherished secret—the name of the manufacturer of the goods.

Letters may get into the wrong hands and cause endless mischief. In a certain building in Glasgow were two young women of the same name, and one of them, who, unfortunately lived at the top, had a sweetheart, a sailor. While he was away on a voyage he wrote to her. The postman, having no number to guide him, delivered his letters to the young woman on the ground floor, who opened them and circulated the contents.

Naturally, the other girl was furious, and complained to the postmaster; but as the actual recipient of the letters declared they were intended for her, and it was impossible to communicate at once with the sender, the true position was not discovered for a long time.

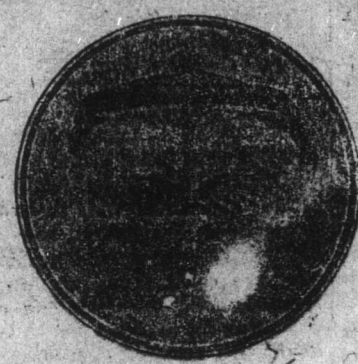
