Our Montreal Letter

(From Our Own Correspondent.) CANADA'S FOREST RESOURCES EMPLOY MANY.

There are upwards of 100,000 people n Canada actively, engaged in converting the products of the forest into wealth in some form or another and with their families this means that half'a million people in the Dominion are dependent on the forest for their living. The value of the manufactured pulp and paper products alone is \$250,000,000 per year. The pulp and paper companies employ 33,000 men in the mills and pay them each year \$40,000,000 in wages. The value of lumber, lath and shingles produced in Canada in one year is \$150,000,000. If the lumber industry proper has an invested capital of \$250,000,000, employing 55,000 men, and paying them \$60,000,000 wages. then you have a forest business that reaches the stupendous distribution in Canada of \$500,000,000 a year. And all this comes from Canada's forest re-


