Government Control of Railways.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 10.—The Senate spent three hours today in debate upon the resolution offered by Mr. Pfeiffer, looking to Government control of interstate railroads, the regulation of their freight and passenger rates, the fixing of wages of railroad employees, the acquisition and operation of all coal beds of the country, and many other ideas of the Populist party. Senate adjourned at 5:15.
