

FORTUNE IN LACE FOR MISS GOELET

Magnificent Costume To Be Worn by Roxburghe's Bride.

REJECTS VEIL AND FLOWERS

In Order That the Beauty of Her Dress Shall Not Be Obscured at the Altar.

New York, Nov. 2.—Sentiment as well as money will find expression in the gown which Miss Mary Goelet will wear on the occasion of her marriage to the Duke of Roxburghe at St. Thomas Church on Nov. 10. While the shops of Europe have been searched for the most beautiful lace which makes it, the country roads of England, with their hawthorn hedges have furnished the suggestions for its trimming. The tiny white blossoms which bear the name, the May-flower of the duke's future home, is introduced in the soft folds of the bridal dress which the future duchess will wear and which is one of the most exquisite creations of the kind ever imported to this city.

Made by Worth, it is a masterpiece of the dressmaker's art and is worth a king's ransom. It is made entirely of English point lace, as old almost as some of the jewels which will be Miss Goelet's marriage portion from the gem basket of the Roxburghe. The dress, which has an immensely long train, is made on a foundation of white satin so rich and thick that it can almost stand alone. The satin has been covered with white tulle, and the lace, which falls from the shoulders, is made of a deep frill of this material which encircles the shoulders in a bertha-like effect.

The yoke is not transparent; in fact, while the dress was made by the king of French dressmakers, it is typically English in this matter. For English brides, as everyone knows, believe in the most modest gowns possible. The front of the skirt is trimmed with the tiny rose-like May-flowers suggested by Miss Goelet's name, and here and there under the court train of lace, which falls from the shoulders, may be seen these little rose-shaped hawthorn blossoms.

With millions at her command, Miss Goelet has chosen a simple tulle veil, which will be fastened with orange blossoms, and according to her present plans, she will wear a crown with her brother, Robert Goelet, who will give her away, part of this veil will cover her face. She will probably dispense with the usual bridal bouquet, as she shares the opinion of those who have seen her gown that it is really too beautiful to have anything detracting from its beauty.

Miss Goelet's bridesmaids—Miss Beatrice Mills, Miss Therese Iselin, Miss Marian Haven, Miss Alice Babcock, Miss Martha Johnston and Miss Thayer, of Boston, are all wearing charming gowns made here. They will be of chiffon, and possibly will be trimmed with ermine, as this fur is indicative of the duke's rank. They will all wear large picture hats and will probably carry bouquets.

The bride's mother, Mrs. Ogden Goelet, who is still in mourning for her brother-in-law, the late Sir Michael Herbert, will be attired in mauve panne velvet and will wear a train to match. About twenty additional men servants were engaged yesterday at the Goelet residence and were sent to the tailoring establishment on Sixth avenue to be measured for the Goelet tuxedos. They will stand about the halls like wallflowers, and detectives will be sprinkled among them to safeguard the bride and guests from the intrusion of any who may not have been invited to the wedding feast.

Johnston will have charge of the carriages and all outside arrangements for St. Thomas, for what will be a very quiet wedding. He could take place without him? He knows everyone and will permit no one to enter without the necessary card of admission.

The ceremony, as already announced, will be performed by Bishop Potter, who will probably be assisted by the rector, the Rev. Dr. Ernest M. Stiles. The Duke of Roxburghe will have several English friends and relatives among the ushers, including probably his cousins, Capt. the Hon. Henry Guest and the Hon. Lionel Guest, sons of Lord Wintborne, whose sister, Lady Rodney, will be among the guests, and the Hon. Reginald Ward, brother of Lord Dudley.

To return to the matter of clothes, only a small portion of Miss Goelet's trousseau has been brought over to this country, as she and the duke have arranged to return to England almost immediately after their wedding. While not half of her finery is here, it has taken nearly twenty trunks to hold it.

EARTHQUAKES IN PERSIA

Destroys Entire Town and Kills 350 Persons.

London, Nov. 2.—A dispatch to the Daily Mail from Simla, India, says terrible earthquakes have occurred at Tursuz, near Turbat-I-Haidari, in Persia, in which 350 persons were killed and numbers were injured. One hundred and eighty-four carpet factories were destroyed and only 32 stalls were left standing in the great bazaar. The entire town was practically demolished.

CHINA "UP AGAINST IT"

Washington, Nov. 2.—Sir Chen Tung Liang, Chinese minister to the United States, acting under instructions from his Government at Peking, has been particularly active recently in the effort to interest the United States Government in China's behalf in her Manchurian troubles. C. P. R. RETRENCHMENT

Many Gangs Laid Off—G. T. R. Is Very Busy.

Ottawa, Nov. 2.—The desire of the Canadian Pacific Railway to reduce its operating expenses caused a large number of men employed by the line on the Ottawa division to be laid off yesterday. The same retrenchment is being practiced elsewhere on the big corporation, which in that respect is following the lead of many American lines.

Toronto, Nov. 2.—Several of the chief officials of the Grand Trunk Railway who are in the city today, when asked if they intended to reduce the staff said: "No, we could not do so if we wanted to. We are handling more business now than we did three months ago, so there is no reason to suppose we will reduce the staff. The only thing that might be done is to put off the working trains, and that will only be done when the weather is bad."

TOMMY ATKINS IN FIGHT

British Troops Surrounded in Hinterland Campaign.

Aden, Arabia, Nov. 2.—A report that an officer and several men of the Bombay Rifles have been wounded in a skirmish in the Hinterland has been confirmed. The fighting is now known to have been quite serious. A small British force was surrounded by tribesmen at Sukut and soon ran short of ammunition. Strong reinforcements were sent out from Dhaba and effected the release of their comrades after a sharp fight. Eight British soldiers were killed and an officer and a number of privates were wounded.

THE ATLAS LOAN INVESTIGATION

A. E. Ames, of Toronto, Examined at Osgoode Hall.

\$151,000 CLAIM AGAINST CO.

Retains Metropolitan Bank Shares as Collateral—The Position of Wallace.

Toronto, Nov. 2.—A. E. Ames, stock broker, was under examination for nearly three hours today before the master-in-ordinary, Thomas Hodgins, K. C., at Osgoode Hall, in connection with the wreck of the Atlas Loan Company of St. Thomas. It will be remembered that A. E. Wallace, president and manager of the Atlas Company, was also a partner in the firm of Ames & Co., and that the suspension of the two concerns took place almost simultaneously in June last. Mr. Ames' evidence showed that to all intents and purposes Wallace and the Atlas Loan Company were identified parties in the transactions with his firm. The examination developed the fact that the National Trust Company as liquidator of the Atlas Loan Company, charges that the latter company have lost outright about \$407,000 in cash and securities turned over to Ames & Co. On the other hand, Ames & Co. at present claim that the Atlas Loan still owes them about \$151,000 and retain 1,000 shares in the Metropolitan Bank, subscribed for by the company as collateral. In connection with these shares it transpired that several months before the prospectus of the Metropolitan Bank was issued, it was arranged by Mr. Ames with Mr. Wallace that the Atlas Loan Company should purchase \$100,000 of paid-up stock in the bank at 200.

Counsel first elicited the fact that news of the suspension of Ames & Co. on June 2 last had been telegraphed at once to A. E. Wallace, at St. Thomas. The notice of suspension was telegraphed to St. Thomas and Toronto was identified. At that time Ames & Co. were carrying securities of the Atlas Company, but when the suspension took place they were all in the hands of lenders who had advanced money to the firm.

Mr. Ames said that forced sales did not occur in all cases. Forced sales took place on June 9 and June 12, of which 2,600 of Amalgamated Copper stocks were sold on the date first named, and \$5 on June 12.

Counsel pointed out that on June 2 there was an item under the account "Atlas Loan Company" showing a sale of 200 shares of Union Pacific. That was also a forced sale. The explanation was that lenders in London and elsewhere had found it necessary to sell stocks. The Atlas took the risk of hypothecation by the lender if the margin was not maintained by Ames & Co.

Mr. Ames told of the stock he carried in the Ames & Co. in connection with the securities carried for the Atlas Loan, he had never rendered a statement, but in a letter to Mr. Wallace he had said he was carrying \$300,000 worth of stock on a nominal margin and deducting Mr. Wallace's account he was carrying \$700,000 in stock for the Atlas Loan. He had very little knowledge of the Atlas Loan Company's financial condition.

He said that the company could not on June 2 pay their debt balance, and that the sale of securities was necessary. Ames & Co. wrote, requesting \$50,000 additional margin and threatening to deal with account in default. Subsequently some shares were sold. The final account rendered was on Oct. 2, and showed that the Atlas owed Ames & Co. \$10,000 for which they held 1,000 shares in the Metropolitan Bank. He was not able to say exactly what these shares were worth, as they were not sold.

London, Nov. 2.—The Tokio correspondent of the Daily Mail reports a serious affray at Chemulpo, Corea, between Russian bluejackets belonging to the gunboat Bohr, and Japanese bluejackets from the cruiser Chiyoda and a number of Japanese residents of Chemulpo. Ten Japanese and several Russians were injured.

The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Daily Mail says the Russian Government has decided to expel all of the Japanese living along the route of the Manchurian railway, having discovered that many of them were spies.

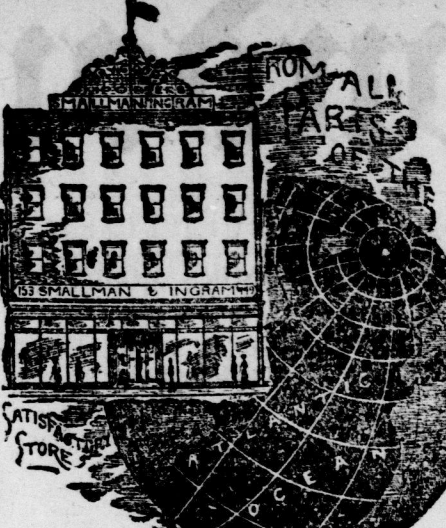
