When new Mr. Glaubitz's car cost \$3,400 in Detroit, but the City of London bought it second-hand for \$1,-500, and paid the 35 per cent duty on it, bringing the cost up to over \$2,000. It had only been run one season by Chief of Police Croull, of Detroit, who gets a new car.
