



#### REV. DR. RAINSFORD **RESIGNS MINISTRY**

Feels That His Health Will Permit More Effective Work as Layman.

New York, June 1. - The Rev. Dr. William S. Rainsford, formerly rector of St. George's Church, more recently hunter of hig game in Africa, has re-linquished the ministry. At his own Though no reasons are made public, it is said the doctor feels that his health will permit him to do more effective work as a layman.

When Dr. Rainsford came her from Toronto in 1883 to become rector of St. George's, the church was practically without a congregation. Under his direction it became a great insti-tutional church, with a trade school, a parish building, a deaconess house, seaside cottage, boys' and girls' clubs and 6,000 communicants.
