

SINKING OF MOHEGAN

One Hundred Lives Were Lost in Seemingly Inexplicable Disaster.

All Observers Save Her Navigators Noticed Unusual Course Before Vessel Struck.

Falmouth, Oct. 15.—Only 31 survivors reached shore last night from the wrecked steamer Mohegan, but a number of others were rescued this morning.

It is exceedingly difficult to trace the events of the disaster, but so far as can be ascertained from the accounts of those who were on board, the vessel was struck by a strong southeast wind blowing, and that there was a heavy ground swell on and a strong current running.

The latest list shows that only 11 passengers were saved.

SOME OF THE VICTIMS. St. Keverne, Oct. 15.—In the lower end of the church here 15 bodies, among them those of four women and a 12-year-old girl. The bodies are laid out reverently.

Falmouth, Oct. 15.—The bodies of six persons—four males and two females—have been picked up and landed here.

Mr. A. G. L. Smith, who was among those saved, says his home is in Oregon. In conversation with the representative of the Associated Press, Mr. Smith said that he saw the captain on the bridge giving orders, which were carried out as far as possible.

Mr. Geo. Maule, of New York, says: "I am a shipper of horses, employed by the Atlantic Transport Company. We left London on Tuesday morning and went until 7 o'clock yesterday evening.

When most of the passengers were at dinner, the steamer was given to speed, and suddenly we heard a loud crash, which seemed to denote that we had collided with some object.

When we rushed on deck we found the Mohegan was on the rocks between the Manacles and Lowlands in the vicinity of the Lizard. Orders were given to immediately lower the boats, and the crew of the steamer behaved like heroes.

Mr. Moore, a seaman belonging to London, was among those who succeeded in reaching Port-Houston. He said the steamer struck on the rocks, and the board side of her bow sank head-first, the stern rising up in the air.

From other sources it was learned that the Mohegan sank about twenty minutes after she was on the rocks.

Local seamen who have been questioned on the subject appear unable to say where the Mohegan got into such a position. One of the passengers among the 45 persons rescued by the Port-Houston lifeboat says just previous to the Mohegan going down he thought the steamer nearer land than usual.

The coast guardsman who was on duty at Cove Point has noticed the Mohegan was pursuing a dangerous course, but was unable to do anything.

IF SPAIN HAD KNOWN
