FORT WILLIAM, Sept. 24.-F. W. Thompson, vice-president and general manager of the Ogilvie Mills, Ltd., announced this afternoon that the Ogilvies will double the capacity of the Winnibeg mill. construction of the Winnipog mill, construction to start this fall.

The present capacity of the Winnipeg mill is 4,000 barrels a day. It was built in 1881 with a capacity of 1,800 burnels and enlarged at various times and modern machinery added, bringing it up to its present large capacity. The elevator capacity at the Winnipeg mill was increased this year by a 300,000 bushel new elevator.
