The output of coal from Canadian mines during January, 1923, amounted to 1,724,000 tons.

The total wheat production of Canada in 1922 was 297,546,000 bushels of which Saskatchewan produced 70,167,000 bushels.

Heads of large implement and machinery companies in Ontario and Calgary state that for every acre of corn that was sown in Alberta last year there will be some this year.

1923 will be the greatest prospecting year known so far in Northern Ontario. The largest rush of prospectors is in the district extending from Swastika for a hundred miles east into the Province of Quebec.

Grain men and others in Calgary already forecast the probable yield of wheat in Alberta this year at something in the neighborhood of 100,000,000 bushels. This estimate is based on the 65,000,000 bushel crop of last year.

The total wheat production in Canada has grown from 172,000 bushels in 1871 to over 297,000,000 in 1922. The number of elevators in 1908 was 525 with capacity for 15,200,000 bushels. To-day the capacity of 1,924 elevators in Canada is 231,633,420 bushels.

The Canadian Pacific Railway have further reduced the freight rate on horses from prairie stations to all eastern Canada points. The old rate on horses from Moose Jaw to Montreal or Toronto was 21.00 per hundred pounds. The new rate will be 18.00 or a saving to the farmer of 38 per cent.

"Will Summers," owned by His Majesty the King, was recently brought to Canada on the Canadian Pacific liner "Albatross" and will be kept at the Prince of Wales ranch near Calgary for breeding purposes. This famous five-year-old has a pedigree back to Orme and Galop, the former sire of Flying Fox and the latter a Derby winner.

It is reported that the head of the textile department of Leeds University, England, has put forward a process for the making of artificial wool from cotton waste. The basis of the process is cellulose acetate. The product wears well as wool, it is said, will take the dye of any desired color and is considered a better insulator than natural wool.

During the last fiscal year Canadian exports of tobacco amounted to 71,091 pounds with a value of \$175,826. Of this value the United Kingdom accounted for \$135,784, the United States \$216 and other countries \$34,826. There are 125 tobacco factories in Canada, Quebec and Ontario being the principal producers.

Running on schedule the Canadian Pacific liner "Empress of Canada," Captain J. H. Bailey, again demonstrated her right to the claim of "Queen of the Pacific." The Canadian vessel left Vancouver 24 hours after the American liner "President McKinley" and arrived in Yokohama five hours in the lead.

The British Government is completing at Chatham the largest and most wonderful under-water craft in the world. On the surface she will displace 2,780 tons and when submerged 3,600 tons, this displacement being 1,400 tons greater than that of the largest German submarine. With a twelve-inch gun the new submarine will be able to bombard any object and then quickly disappear under the sea.

Wet Majority in Manitoba

Government Pledged to Put the Controlled Sale System into Effect

Winnipeg, June 25.—On the strength of returns from rural polls received this afternoon it was estimated that the final majority for the moderate bill would fall not far short of 35,000.

The "wet" majority which stood above 30,000 last night, seemed to be eluding slowly although many districts traditionally dry were still to be heard from and it is possible that they may pull down the present figure.

Few constituencies will report complete figures to-day.

Seven Winnipeg polls gave dry majorities. It is shown by a check of figures and the 140 city polls turned in a total wet majority of 25,988. Eighty-five per cent of the registered voters went to the polls.

REFUSERS 1921

WAGES RATES IN N. S. COAL FIELDS

New Glasgow, N. S., June 25.—A reply has been received from the British Empire Steel Corporation at Montreal, refusing to put in force 1921 wage rates in the coal fields of Nova Scotia and it is understood that the district convention of miners here spent yesterday in discussing the refusal and what line of action they should follow.

J. B. MacLachlan, secretary, said that he was not able to make any official announcement last night. He did say that a telegram had been sent to the corporation asking the immediate putting into effect of the 1921 wage agreement, giving one day as the time for reply. The reply and refusal were received yesterday.

Get After the Tent Caterpillar

When the Caterpillars are very abundant in the orchard they may defoliate every tree. Sometimes this defoliation takes place two or three years in succession. The result is that not only the crop is lost each year but the trees are left in a greatly weakened condition and sometimes succumb to the strain of a severe winter.

The full grown larvae are about two inches in length, of a general brownish black color, with a conspicuous white stripe down the middle of the back.

METHODS OF CONTROL.—The best method of control is to spray the trees with a solution of lead or one-half to one-third pound of PARIS GREEN to every gallon of water. This will destroy the caterpillars.

Cutting down trees which are infested with tent caterpillars will help to keep them from spreading and destroying of other trees in the winter or early spring.
