The advance was well sustained, the closing being within %c of the top. Late cables were quite conflicting. Liverpool being strong, London and, Berlin decidedly weak and Paris and Antwerp steady. A special cable reported shipments for the past week from all quarters to the United Kingdom and continent. 10,740,000 bushels against about 7,000,000 weekly requirements, and this was considered a bearish feature. Much will depend on to-morrow's foreign advices.
