GUARDED HUN ELECTIONS.

Incidents In the Occupation of Town In Germany.

It was in a German beer garden in rather important town in the Rhine a rather important town in the Rhine districts occupied by the Canadian Corps, writes a Canadian in Germany. And since the German town centres round its beer gardens it was there I found the best answer to my anxiety about the fraternizing of old-time enemies. I had watched all year, from closeup, the organized and year, from closeup, the organized and unremitting hatred of the Canadian soldier for the fighting Hun. And from the same grand stand seat of war correspondent I had ample proof that the affection of the grey-coated German for the persistent, indefatigable, fearless Canadian was of the same calibre—longer drawn out. But of the Canadian memory I was not so certain.

The beer garden was the typical German one—a roomy theatre, with large stage in front, cheap chairs that could be turned towards the performance or the glass of beer that once stood on the tables, and a bar extending across the entire rear. The stage was incidental, the chairs a medium only. The bar was the main idea in the old days of German guzzling and community life.

Now it was difficult. The long bar was half closed off, concealing a kitchen where tea and coffee urns stood ready for the evening's business. The seats were neatly arranged, with their faces towards the stage. The stage was a riot of red, white and blue. Indeed, the whole setting was so patriotic as to remind me of early war days when conscription was de-layed on behalf of voluntary enlist-

ment and the senses and sentiment were the mediums of appeal.

The manner of metamorphosis required no explanation. A Canadian Y.M.C.A. officer was my guide. When Canadian soldiers began to filter in to the town the Y.M.C.A. arrived with the first consignment. And the very first set of the officer was to very first act of the officer was to ferret out the buildings suitable to his purposes of entertainment. And the beer garden—as in many another German village—supplied one of his most pressing wants. And the second phase of operations was to decorate

in the flags and colors of the Allies.

The building seemed empty when
I entered. But as we moved down
the aisle two solid, silent figures
loomed from the gloom — soldiers

seated several chairs apart in the very front row.

Grim they sat, with frowning brows and firm chins, their arms folded in that instinctive expression of immovable determination. They scarcely shifted to look at us. There might have been a liquid rank grape.

scarcely shifted to look at us. There might have been a lieutenant-general up there on the stage, with these his guards. The officer explained. The beer garden was the largest hall in town. It was also the local symbol of authority. The German elections were crowding. And the mayor had humbly craved of the Y the use of the hall for a pre-election meeting that afternoon. With the promise of dismissal at five in order not to interfere with the regular Y program, consent was given. Later program, consent was given. Later the request—almost a demand—was for a two hours' extension. But the beer garden was the property of the soldiers for the time; and five was

insisted upon as the time limit.
Some soldier conceived the idea
that the super-decorations of the
theatre in the Allied colors might not be completely in accord with the feelings of a German political meet-ing. He passed it on. It developed into a decision—unofficial—to establish two Canadians of good physique where every movement of the main actors on the stage would be under

actors on the stage would be under their supervision.

And there they sat, an hour before opening time, not a whit impatient. I thought I detected something the opposite of impatience in their demeanor. I looked from their set jaws and anticipatory eyes to the stage, where a table was already surrounded with chairs for the political discussion. Across the frost tical discussion. Across the froit, below the footlights, stretched a three-foot strip of red, white and blue. The dingy scenery was camouthree-loot strip or rea, white and blue. The dingy scenery was camou-flaged in flags and colors. A great Union Jack depended from one chandelier on the right stage, and a Stars and Stripes from another chandelier to the left. It was a ridiculously incongruous setting for a political meeting in a country that had preached hate of those colors for four years.
