Deliberations of the Council of Agriculture. May 28th, 1890.

Copy of the report of a Committee of the honorable Executive Council, dated the 8th September, 1890.

No. 411: concerning certain proceedings of the Council of Agriculture.

The Honorable the Commissioner of Agriculture and Colonization, in a report dated 3rd Septomber 1890, recommends that the resolutions of which copy is annexed to the said report adopted by the Council of Agriculture, dated the 28th May, 1890, be approved by the Lientenant Governor in Council, in accordance with article 1614 of the Revised Statutes. The "Resolutions" approved of by the above mentioned Order in Council are the numbers 3, 5, 7, 9, 10, 11, 17, and 19 of the following deliberations.

The Council of Agriculture met at 10 A. M.; the president in the chair.—Present : Col. the Hon. W. Rhodes, Commissioner of agriculture, etc., the Hon. Messrs. Joly de Lotbinière, President of the Council of Agriculture; Onimet, superintendent of public education, and L. Sylvestre; Messrs. W. Blackwood, A Casgrain, E. Casgrain, Descarrices, Guilbeault, Marsan, Ness. Péloquin. Ricard, Ritchie, and Valois. Were also present, Dr. J. A. Couture, veterinary surgeen to the Council, and M. Nagant, assistant-editor of the Journal d'agriculture.

The deliberations of the last meeting were read and approved.

A letter of excuse for not attending the meeting, from M. Morier, M. C. A., was read and accepted. The Hon. F. Dionne was also prevented, by a serious accident, from being present.

No. 1.—Proposed by M. G. Ouimet, seconded by M. Tarte :
