PAST SUPREME CHIEF RANGER.

The esteem in which he is held by his

brethren found a fitting expression last month when he was presented with a complimentary banquet and a solid silver tea service. The occasion was a notable one, not only by reason of the large and representative character of the company, but also by the heartiness and spontaneity of the tribute that each speaker paid to the worth of the guest of the evening.

Bro. Botterell first saw the light in the old limestone city of Kingston, on the 11th of May, 1834. His father was a soldier, being a member of the 15th regiment of the line. He received an English
