RELIGIOUS RIOTS IN TURKEY-GERMAN AND FRENCH CONSULS MURDRERD — A Serious riot occurred in Salonica, European Turkey, on Saturday, between Christians and Mahomet ans. The trouble arose from the fact that a Christian girl wished to become a Mahome tan. She was forcibly taken from her Tur-kish friends by the Greeks. During the riot the French and German Consuls were assas the Frence and German Consuls were assassinated by Mahometaus. Further disturbances are apprenheded. At last accounts the authorities had taken no measures to protect life and property, and no arrests had been made.—It is stated in Constantinople that a body of Christians, who attention to the the the authorities of the constantino of ed to take the would be convert from the Turkish quarter of Salonica, acted at the instigation of the American Consul. Fighting between Christiaus and Turks ensued. The French and German Consuls went to the Mosque, and were killed by the exas-perated Mahometan populace, notwithstand ing the efforts of the Governor to protect them - A frigate left Constantinople for Salonica, with Etherif Pasha, who has just been appointed Governor of Stlonica; the Turkish Commissioner, the second Dragoman of the French Embassy, and the German Consul at Canstantinople are also on board. The punishment of the guilty has been ordered, with the publicity befuting the gravity of the crime. A French manof-war left Constantinople immediately on receipt of the news to protect the lives and interest of the French citizens and the honor of the flag.
