

MAIL CONVEYANCE FROM HALIFAX TO GUYSBORO'. VIA THE GREAT EASTERN ROAD.

PERSONS desirous of entering into a Contract for the conveyance of Her Majesty's Mails from HALIFAX to GUYSBORO', via the Great Eastern Road, passing through and serving the settlements of Middle and Upper Musquodoboit, Glamsie, (St. Mary's), and Country Harbour, once a week each way, are requested to send in **SEALED TENDERS** addressed to the Post Master General, stating the sum per annum in Halifax Currency, for which they would agree to perform the service.

The Conditions of the Contract are, that the Mails shall be conveyed on such days and such hours from either end of the route, as may from time to time be pointed out by the Post Master General, the rate of speed to be not less than *Five Miles an hour*, and the Mails to be conveyed by Horse and Wagon or on Horseback.

A notice of *Three Months* to be given on either side to terminate the Contract.

Security will be required for the due and faithful performance of the Service.

Tenders which must be made out in the proper form supplied by the Department for the purpose, and which can be had on application at the General Post Office, Post Office Quay, Middle and Upper Musquodoboit, will be received until **MONDAY, the 11th of July, next** (at noon) and the Service to commence on the 1st of August, 1856.
