The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Howard Green, announced today the following appointments in the Canadian diplomatic service:

Mr. Jules Léger, at present Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Canada to the North Atlantic Council, Paris, to be Ambassador to Italy;

Mr. George Ignatieff, at present an Assistant Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, to be Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Canada to the North Atlantic Council, Paris;

Mr. Paul Tremblay, at present Ambassador to Chile, to be Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York;

Mr. Saul F. Rae, at present Minister at the Canadian Embassy in Washington, to be Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Canada to the European Office of the United Nations in Geneva;

Mr. H. B. Robinson, at present serving in Ottawa, to replace Mr. Rae as Minister in Washington;

Mr. J. K. Starnes, at present an Acting Assistant Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, to be Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany and Head of the Canadian Military Mission in Berlin;

Mr. Ross Campbell, at present serving in Ottawa, to be an Assistant Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs;

Mr. Arthur Andrew, at present Head of the Information Division, to be Ambassador to Israel.
