PRAYERS.

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had passed the following bills to which the concurrence of this House is desired:

Bill S-40, An Act to incorporate Triassic Products Transmission Company.—*Mr. Addison.*

Bill S-41, An Act to authorize the construction of a bridge and a causeway over the St. Lawrence River near the city of Pointe-aux-Trembles.—*Mr. Rouleau.*

The said bills were deemed to have been read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House pursuant to Standing Order 103(2).

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Fisher, seconded by Mr. Knowles, it was ordered,—That the question of Raymond Spencer Rodgers' right to use the facilities of the Press Gallery be referred for quick study and a report back to the House on its merits by the Standing Committee on Privileges and Elections.

Mr. Chevrier, for Mr. Pearson, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of letters, dated November 2, 1963, addressed by the Prime Minister of Canada to the Premiers of the Provinces concerning the agenda and procedures for the Federal-Provincial Conference proposed for November 25, 1963.
