Dear Dr. Snell: Referring to my previous letter to Professor Maw, a copy of which was forwarded to you, I wish to call your attention to the fact that young birds are still being maintained on the range at the Poultry Plant. We have autopsied a number of these birds and Dr. Cameron has informed me that some have been brought into the Parasite Institute suffering from black head. To-date I have not had any comfirmation of the verbal request made by Sir Arthur concerning my authority in this matter.
