

*Supplementary By-laws sanctioned by the Lieutenant  
Governor in council, 10th December, 1885.*

40. No person shall transfer a certificate of vaccination or of freedom from infection to another person, nor shall any person produce any such certificate so transferred under the penalty provided by the Act.

41. All the powers and duties conferred on local Boards of Health may be exercised by any member or executive officer of the Central Board of Health duly authorized thereto by the same, whenever municipalities or Local Boards refuse or neglect to comply with the by laws, rules and regulations of the Central Board of Health.

42. Any mayor or other head of a municipal corporation, or other chief municipal officer, who refuses to call a special meeting of the municipal council of the place, to form a local board of health, after he has received two days' notice from the Central Board of Health to do so, and that the proclamation provided by the act is in force, shall incur the penalty provided by the act.

43. Any member or officer of a local board of health who refuses to comply with the order of the central board of health shall be liable to the penalty provided by the act.

44. No physician shall give a certificate of vaccination unless he has had a personal knowledge of successful vaccination having been performed upon the person in whose favor it is granted, within a period of five years.

45. No physician shall give a certificate of freedom from infection unless he can state that the person and his premises have been disinfected in accordance with the printed instructions of the central board of health to medical officers.

46. No person, but a clergyman or a physician, shall visit a house or other building in which small-pox exists.

47. All directors and professors of any educational establishment shall refuse admission to any pupil who has not been vaccinated within a period of five years, and shall not keep in their service any person who has not been so vaccinated.

48. Every station-master railway or street car conductor, or omnibus or coach-driver is authorized to prevent any persons from travelling in the rail or street cars or omnibus or coach, under their care, who do not produce, upon requisition, certificates of vaccination and freedom from infection, if they come from infected houses or districts.

49. Every station-master or railway conductor is authorized to prevent any person from visiting or loitering about railway stations, who do not produce, upon requisition, certificates of vaccination and freedom from infection, if they come from infected houses or districts.

50. Any person advising or inciting others to resist or disobey the by-laws, rules and regulations of the Central Board of Health, shall be liable to the penalty provided by the Act.

51. When a municipality has persistently refused or neglected to 'carry out the instructions and regulations of the Central Board of Health, and small-pox is prevalent in the said municipality, adjoining municipalities may, if they consider it advisable, quarantine the municipality in default, by barricading the streets, &c., and adopting such other measures of quarantine, as may, under the circumstances, be considered advisable.
