Taft Says Tariff Must Be Revised Only on Accurate Information. WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 .- President

Taft to-day carried out his threat to veto the wool tariff bill. In a special message to the house of representa-tives he characterized the measure as a blend of an avowed tariff for revenue and anti-protection measure with a professed protection bill. In explanation of his course President Taft said the bill was not in harmony with the pitform on which he was elected. Furthermore, he declared that the American people are "deeple im-pressed with the conviction" that the

interest of the consuming public can be properly guarded only by revising the tariff one schedule at a time, and then upon "accurate and scientifically acquired information." Mix-Up on Mortgage.
