CANADIAN RAILWAY MEN ASKING LARGE ADVANCE IN WAGES

Follows Recommendation of United States War Board for Higher Pay.

WILL WAIT ON McADOO

Canadian War Board's Decision to Be Made After Washington Action.

Montreal, May 19.-A sub-committee of the war railway board (the organization of railway managers of the three big Canadian roads, appointed by the Dominion Government) have had under consideration a request of the employees of the three roads for an increase of wages. In the United States a similar board has recommended to the national director of railways (Hon. Mr. McAdoo, secretary of the treasury) an increase of the United States road equal to a twenty per cent. increase. Mr. McAdoo has not yet given his decision. The Canadian war board will await the Washington decision; and if they have to go up it is certain that the cabinet at Ottawa as well as the government at Washington will have to authorize a further increase in railway rates. The increases in the United States involve over three hundred millions a year.

WAITING FOR CANADIAN NORTHERN FINDING

Union Government Supporters Expecting Decision by Arbitration Board on Value of Shares.

Ottawa, May 19.-The session is to end next week and the supporters of the Union Government before they leave for home would like to see a decision reached by the board of arbitration at Toronto on the value of the shares of the Canadian Northern Railway. The arbitrators are limited to ten millions of dollars, and if anything like a joint offer is made by them, the members of the house who supported the taking over of the C.N.R. have every expectation of the new directors for the C.N.R. to be appointed before Sir Robert Borden leaves for England, and a genuine effort made to join up the national lines into one system and a real effort made to improve the railway situation in Canada. Word has been received here that Sir William Meredith and his colleagues will reach a decision in a few days more.

AUSTRALIANS CARRY OUT RAID AT MORLAIRCOURT

London, May 19.-Field Marshal Haig reports that the headquarters in France last night say: "Successful raids, in which we took a number of prisoners and two machine guns, were carried out this morning in daylight in the Morlaircourt sector and south of Hulluch. In the former enterprise Australian troops, in a surprise attack, captured 21 prisoners and a machine gun without incurring any casualties themselves. The hostile artillery was somewhat more active this morning in the Villers-Bretonneux sector."

UKRAINE GETS LOAN.

Central Powers to Send Four Million Marks to New Government.
The Hague, May 19.-The central powers have granted a loan of four million marks to Ukraine, according to a dispatch from Kiev to The Tagblatt of Berlin, giving the details of the financial agreement with the new republic. The loan is payable at the rate of 75 kopecks per mark and 50 kopecks per kroner for German and Austrian money, respectively. By repaying the existing issues of paper money in Ukraine, the Germans hope to force the peasants there to give up their large gold reserves.
