WHO'S BOOMING IT?

Some Parties are Working the News Service With a Great Gold Boom in Michigan.

Detroit, Mich., Sept. 6.—(By Associated Press.)—An special dispatch was received to-day by The Evening News from Wawa City, the newly-laid-out town in the Michigan gold country on Lake Wawa, Ontario.

As to the gold discoveries developing in Michigan, the indications given it can be said that quartz has been found in one section, but in other places, extending over several thousand acres. Quartz has been found there containing free gold in about as big a quantity of wheat-gold in its pure form, which does not have to be subjected to a chemical process to free it from the rocks.

A SENSATION IN ENGLAND

Over Expected Revelations in Connection With the Private Institutions for the Deaf and the Alleged Insane.

London, Sept. 6.—Mr. George W. E. Russell, cousin of the present Duke of Bedford, and Under Secretary of State for the Home Department in the Rosebery Administration, has inaugurated a movement calling for the abolition of the private mad houses, and has announced his intention of presenting Parliament to take steps in that direction as soon as ever it re-assembles.

DEAD AS A DOOR NAIL.

Mr. John Torrance Talks About the New East Atlantic Contract.

Montreal, Sept. 6.—Mr. John Torrance, agent of the Dominion Line, has returned from a trip to England, regarding the proposed fast line for which the Dominion Government, Mr. Torrance states that the scheme, as far as the Dominion Government is concerned, is dead as a door nail.

Catholic Ordinances.

At St. Basil's Church Bishop O'Connor on Sunday presided at a meeting of young men who are members of the Community of St. Basil and are attached to the staff of St. Michael's College. A Tramp's Usual Death.

Phenix, Ariz., Sept. 6.—The city marshal and a posse, after a hard fight, captured three tramps who had robbed several trunks at Conway, a small town in Western Wash County, and placed them in the city jail. At an early hour Sunday morning the tramps were taken to a fire and before the flames could be extinguished one of the vagrants was cremated, and almost immediately he fell over the bench where he was working and expired. He had been in poor health for a year past, but seemed all right when he commenced work yesterday.

Wild Horses a Nuisance.

Phoenix, Ariz., Sept. 6.—Wild horses have become so much of a nuisance in Northern Arizona that Attorney-General Frazier has been asked if they may legally be slaughtered. That vicinity has been overrun by several large bands, hundreds in number, unbranded and unclaimed by anyone. They have rapidly increased in numbers and have become wilder than ever, and are attacking and killing stock.

A Drunken Man's Tragic Death.

New York, Sept. 6.—After drinking a flask of whiskey on a wager, 35-year-old Abraham Rosenthal, who imagined himself a tragedian and danced about his apartments on East 24th-street, with a big knife in his hand, committed a fatal frenzy and plunged the weapon twice into his left breast, inflicting wounds from which he died.

An Ore Train Wrecked.

Ravenna, O., Sept. 6.—An iron ore train on the Pittsburg and Western Railroad was wrecked two miles east of this city at a crossing with the Erie. The train was carrying a load of iron ore and a brakeman Hawley A. Thome of this place was instantly killed. Michael Zebb, a tramp, was fatally injured. The wreck was caused by a broken frog.

One Way to Treat Smallpox.

Columbus, Miss., Sept. 6.—A negro woman named Anna Huch, suspected of having contracted smallpox, escaped from custody and attended a church and created a panic among the congregation. She was run out of the church and nothing more was heard of her until she was found dead with her skull crushed in in an open field.

Labour Day in New York.

New York, Sept. 6.—The Labor Day at Government, state and municipal offices were closed, with the exception of the Custom House, which was open for the morning. Although the day was observed as a general holiday, no special classes, in its fullest and most comprehensive term, there was no parade of the workers, and no special observance of the day.

An Awful Death.

Moreton, Ill., Sept. 6.—The electric light plant owned by Byer Bros. & Company, valued at \$14,000, was completely demolished to-day by the bursting of a boiler. Two girls, aged 5 and 9, were killed outright and two boys, aged 4 and 12, were seriously hurt.

Panic in a Theatre.

San Francisco, Sept. 6.—A fire in the Orpheum Variety Theatre, just before the close of last night's performance, created much excitement and panic. Loss of life was narrowly averted. The casualties were confined to slight injuries to a few persons.

Tenders for India Bills. London, Sept. 6.—The Secretary of State for India, Lord George Hamilton, has invited tenders for India bills, payable in six or twelve months, at the option of the holders, to the amount of \$2,500,000.

IS IT 65 OR 67?

The Miners Will Meet to-morrow to Settle a Rate of Wages as a Compensation.

Pittsburg, Pa., Sept. 6.—Mass meetings are being held to-day all over the Pittsburgh district by the striking miners for the purpose of appointing delegates to the district convention, which meets here to-morrow to consider the Columbus compromise and elect delegates to the national convention at Columbus on Wednesday. While some of the leading miners have stated that they will content for instructions to the Columbus delegates to vote for 65 cents or nothing, it is thought that the 65-cent men will be in a minority and unable to successfully urge their plan.

DIED AT HIS WORK.

George Crozier, a Journeyman Tailor, Succumbed to Heart Failure.

Yesterday afternoon death came suddenly to George Crozier, a tailor employed by Mr. James Allison, 294 Yonge street. Deceased, who was 25 years of age, was a single man and resided with his widowed mother at 112 Cumberland-street. He was at work with several other men when he complained of feeling unwell and almost immediately he fell over the bench where he was working and expired. He had been in poor health for a year past, but seemed all right when he commenced work yesterday.

YELLOW FEVER IN THE SOUTH.

Strict Quarantine Has Been Arranged Against Biloxi and Ocean Springs.

New Orleans, La., Sept. 6.—President Oliphant of the Louisiana Board of Health sent a telegram to that board at 10 o'clock today, confirming the report that the physicians at Ocean Springs had declared that the prevailing sickness was undoubtedly yellow fever. The doctors of three states came to this conclusion after holding an autopsy on the body of a person who died yesterday. The State Board of Health decided to enforce a rigid quarantine against Biloxi and Ocean Springs.

The Crop Situation.

The French wheat crop is estimated at 31,000,000 quarters by the chief writers of the Paris press. Correspondents of English business firms state that the crop will amount to from 33,000,000 to 34,000,000 quarters. The Austro-Hungarian crop is stated to be 17,000,000 quarters. If this is true, it adds greatly to the gravity of the situation."
