

A DEFICIT OF £23,000,000 is Estimated for the Coming Year by the Chancellor of the Exchequer of Great Britain. London, April 6 .- On the third reading of he Finance bill in the House of Commons Church Authorities Would Not Alto-day, the Chancelor of the Exchequer, Sir Michael Hicks Beach, gave revised estimates for 1900, the revenue being placed at £127,520,000 and the expenditure at £150,000,000. The deficit, he said, would be met partly from the war loan and partly from Treasury bills. Each week, he declared, showed a greater improvement in trade, which would offset the losses caused by the premature withdrawal of bonded goods.
