Cooper, and as he had made a new and better offer for the east end hall, he would like to be given a

definite answer at once. In conclusion, Mr. Crabb charged the newspapers with being responsible for the loss of the Deering works to London, as they had given publicity to the fact that Tenders will be received till the company was seeking to come to this city, and other places then outbid London. Ald Garratt and Matthews attempted to explain to Mr. Crabb how it was that his tender had not been considered as speedily as he desired, but the explanation appeared to be anything but satisfactory to him, and he withdrew from the meeting. It was then stated that Mr. Crabb's second offer was \$1,000 better than the first, but that it was not considered satisfac-
