

C. G. S., Blenhelm: Q.—1. Would It be all right for me, in category E, to go and be examined now before I am called?

2. Is there a medical examiner for the M. S. A. in Kent County?

3. Is there any special date set for the calling up of class E men?

A.—No; if the authorities wish to have you examined they will notify you. Ou.
12. No: there are examiners for volunteers. Dr. C. B. Langford is in charge at Blenheim.
3. Category E men are not being called up, and it is unlikely that they ever will be. They are being re-examined from time to time.

BELMONT: Q.—I have been to report for duty. Am A2, and have had three brothers in the army. One has been killed, one has been discharged totally disabled, and the other is serving in the navy. I have also a brother-in-law in the army. Have I a title to exemption from the M. S. A.?

A.—It is unlikely that you can get exemption if you have been called upon to report for duty. You do not state your age. You might apply to your commanding officer for leave of absence when you report to your battalion.
