Storm of Protests Evoked by **Proposal To Raze Historic** Old Edifices.

[BY MAYNARD EVANS].

LONDON, July 21.—"Sir, let us walk down Fleet street and inspect the sacred edifices which a vandal and irreligious generation proposes to devote to destruction." Thus Dr. Johnson might have spoken

had he been alive today.

For the bishop of London's commission, of which Lord Hugh Cecil is the leading member, has recommended that 19 of the 47 churches in that worldfamous square mile known as "the City," should be torn down. And Lon-don is filled with a deep and somewhat helpless grief.

helpless grief.

London Heavy With History.

It is a poignant spectacle, this spectacle, of London grieving for its doomed churches. For London, to a degree which no American can understand is heavy with history. London is not a mere world capital. It is not a mere metropolis, with taxis and traffic poticemen.

London is a body of tradition, formed by the slow accretions of centuries.

by the slow accretions of centuries. Memories of the eleventh, the twelfth, the thirteenth centuries, ennoble its stones. It is a body of custom, in which the fourteenth century intrudes its kindly sights and sounds upon the kindly sights and sounds upon the harsher, 'swifter, noisier customs of an age of underground railways. If there were no city of 7,000,000 people in this low-lying Thames valley, there would still be the hovering traditions which make up the real London, to make holy these fog-ridden lowlands.

Of all the monuments about which its ancient memories cluster, London's churches are the most sacred. And of

churches are the most sacred. And of all the churches in the metropolitan area, the city churches are most vocal in their memories of the past. For the city is the oldest section of London. In the raw towns of the American west, the city would be known as the "Old Town." London's Financial Section.

The city is London's financial section. It is to London what Lower Manhattan is to the metropils of New York. That tangled maze of crooked, crowded streets which converge where the Bank of England, the Royal Exchange, and the Mansion House meet, is to London what the corner of Wall and Broad streets is to New York. Lombard street is to London what Wall street is to New York. There was a time when the city was peopled by fat tradesmen who lived up-






