

COL. WILBUR HENDERSON WITH DEATHLESS ARMY

Senior Major of the 48th Highlanders Succumbs to Uraemic Poisoning—Ardent Militiaman.

The 48th Highlanders will take charge of the funeral of Lieut.-Col. Wilbur Henderson, senior major of the regiment, whose death occurred yesterday at his residence, 23 Jameson-avenue.

The cause of death was uraemic poisoning. He had been suffering from kidney disease for some time, and recently at the Quebec celebrations this was aggravated by poisoning attributed to canned peas.

In latter years he has been one of the foremost agents in bringing the 48th Highlanders to their present high state of efficiency. Formerly he exercised revivifying influence on the 4th Regiment of Ontario, in which he held the rank of captain and was endeared to his fellow-officers by his unassuming goodfellowship and pronounced ability as a soldier.

The deceased officer was in command of the bayonet team of the 48th Highlanders which visited England in 1904 and swept everything before them in bayonet fighting.

The pall-bearers will be officers of equal rank with the deceased and the funeral will likely be a large one, as the late colonel was widely known throughout the militia force of the country.

The funeral will take place to-morrow afternoon. A service will be held at the residence, when the remains will be conveyed to the armories, where the regiment will render the last honors.
