LUMBER PRICES HAVE ADVANCED

QUEBEC, May 21.—Not only is the drive on logs on most of the rivers in this province much larger than usual this spring, but prices of lumber both in Britain and the United States, are reported to be from 20 to 30 per cent. higher this year than last, so that lumbermen and sawmill men look for a very prosperous season.

There is already a shortage of ship laborers here at present, and some of the steamships taking on cargo have had to employ part of their own crews at the work.

THE JAIL FOR A SENATOR

The Supreme Court of the United States has rendered a decision in the case of United States Senator Joseph R. Burton of Kansas. The decision was against Burton, affirming the decision of the United States Circuit Court for the Eastern District of Missouri, by which Burton was sentenced to nine months' imprisonment in the jail of that county, Missouri, for failing to pay a fine of \$2,000, and depriving of the right to heretofore hold office under the government.

"If Senator Burton does not resign at once," a prominent senator said this afternoon, "he will be introduced to declare his seat vacant."

The opinion was by Justice Harlan. All of the points made in Burton's interest were overruled.

Senator Burton was presented on the charge of violating section 1782 of the Revised Statutes, which prohibits senators and representatives from receiving compensation for services rendered before any of the government departments in any matter in which the government may be interested. He was specifically charged with accepting a fee of \$200 per month for five months from the Rialto Grain and Scouring Company of St. Louis for services rendered in an effort to prevent the issuance of an order by the Post Office Department prohibiting the use of the mails by the company.

Those who look for the resignation of Joseph R. Burton from the Senate, now that the Supreme Court has upheld the verdict of the St. Louis court, do not know the Abilene statement. The motion for a rehearing, which was granted, will carry the case forward to October, at least. From the earliest possible date of decision on the motion until March 3, 1907, when Burton's term expires, will be less than five months. To tide over that brief interval without being expelled from the Senate would seem to be feasible, and then there would be "no stain on his official career." Burton might very easily convince Kansas that the court proceedings were begun in malice and terminated in hatred. The Supreme Court is not in high favor with the citizens of Abilene; once let him live through his Senate term, he might make a very respectable martyr of himself. Another very potent reason why the Kansas Senator will not resign is that he needs the salary in order to resist the "persecution" of the Supreme Court. In fact, it is impossible for Burton to conceive that he owes anything to Congress in the way of expiation.
