

Another Failure for Spy Plots

How Wireless Plant Was Captured

Letters Furnish Clues

At Least Ten Arrests Expected to Follow Within a Fortnight—Looking for "Men Higher Up."

New York, June 7.—The elaborate German spy plot system added one more failure to its long list in the effort to send wireless plants from the United States to be set up in Mexico. The apparatus shipped by Harry F. Perissi, New York agent of the Allgemeine Electricitats Gesellschaft, or General German Electric Company, and his accomplices to the Mexican agents of that concern got no further than Vera Cruz, where it was seized through the work of agents of the United States government, and is now in the possession of the department of justice. It did not get off the pier at Vera Cruz. This apparatus was shipped from New York in January.

Assistant District Attorney Roosa said today that it was the belief of his office that none of the wireless apparatus sent from New York to Mexico was

ever put in operation. The investigation which led to the arrests here on Sunday and Monday has been under way since the department of justice learned of the shipments of parts of wireless plants from New York to Mexico. A table in Mr. Roosa's office was piled high today with documents seized in the office of Perissi, at 17 Battery Place and in the homes of the other men arrested for complicity in the wireless plot and the operating of an underground mail route to Germany. There were also three suitcases filled with documents which Mr. Roosa had not had time to examine closely. Some of the papers disclosed that agents of the German government had been assembling wireless parts in the back of a store in Greenwich street. During November, several American machinists working on the job, finding out what they were doing quit their places, and when the owner of the property exhibited curiosity as to what was being done on the premises, the "factory" was moved to another house in Greenwich street, where the police said, the outer room was disguised as the office of a tea and coffee importing house.

More Arrests to Follow

The documents taken from the men already held will lead to further arrests. At least two arrests may be expected today, and as many as ten may follow in the next fortnight.

Perissi was released today on \$25,000 bail furnished by William A. Duncan, of Far Rockaway, Irving Bunaparte, a clerk employed by Perissi, and Alex C. Melcher, a saloon keeper, are still held in \$25,000 bail.

The police have discovered that Henry Brecken of 202 Thirty-first street, Brooklyn, who was detained Monday night on the suspicion that he had been connected with the underground mail route between this country and Ger-

many, was formerly an engineer on one of the Hamburg-American line ships at the Brooklyn pier. A year ago he went to work in the main office of the company in Manhattan. The police said he admitted that, on sixteen different occasions he took letters from Germans living in Manhattan and delivered them to German and other sailors in Brooklyn and Hoboken, who said they would find a way to get the letters through to Germany. He did most of this work prior to last November.

Ferdinand H. Adams, of 508 West 140th street, who is also detained by the district attorney, is said to have shown a disposition to tell the authorities all he knows with regard to the German plots in which he was concerned.

Central American Plants.

Efforts are being made to learn why the German electrical concern which Perissi represented, did not manufacture wireless plants in Germany instead of here. The police and detectives have found at least 150 plants for wireless outfits, drawn in great detail, and they have also found that all the plans and bills were approved by one man, supposedly a German agent, whose name is withheld, until it is assured that he is not in New York. The authorities consider it probable that he is in Mexico. He is believed to have been assigned by the German government to the task of establishing a system of wireless communication between America and Germany by means of stations in Mexico and Central America.

While the authorities feel confident that the German attempt to send wireless outfits from New York was a failure, they are not so confident that outfits were sent to Central American countries and set up. There have been frequent reports of powerful wireless plants working from Central America and some months ago the authorities at Colon found a complete outfit destined to a Central American consignment. The district attorney's office and depu-

ty police commissioner Scull, are reticent about the progress of the investigation of the wireless and mail plots. With the exception of Perissi, the men arrested here are regarded as "small fry," as Mr. Roosa put it, and the nets are out for those more responsibly involved. Whether they remained in this country after the declaration of a state of war by the United States is not known, but it is believed they have still important representatives here.

SPRAYING TIME

(New York Sun)

As soon as potatoes are well up they should be sprayed. The little flea beetle begins operations as soon as the plants are four or five inches high and so do the potato bugs. Whether or not potatoes have been grown in the vicinity before, the bugs are sure to be on hand early in the season and crops can only be protected by spraying. Then, too, blight must be checked by a spraying every ten days or two weeks. Cover the plants thoroughly with the spray, the upper and lower surfaces of the foliage. Vitro is a good preparation to use for this purpose or arsenate of lead and bordeaux may be used. If vitro is used ten pounds should be mixed with fifty gallons of water.

For asparagus, beans, other garden vegetables, small fruits and rose bushes one pound of vitro dissolved in five gallons of water will produce the desired result.

Place the required amount of paste in a pail and add cold water gradually, slowly stirring until sufficient water has been added to produce a smooth milk-like liquid. Pour this mixture through a fine wire strainer into the spray tank, which has previously been filled three-fourths full of clean water.

Cucumbers and melons should be sprayed every ten days. Tomato plants should be sprayed as soon as set out and occasionally as required. Young celery plants should be sprayed in the seed bed and at intervals of ten days with a mixture of ten pounds of vitro to fifty gallons of water.

Arsenate of lead spray should be used for codling moth, caterpillars, flea beetles, browntail moth, gypsy moth, cucumber beetle and currant worm and curculio. If paste is used three pounds to fifty gallons of water should be used for codling moth and curculio. For canker worms, caterpillars, cranberry insects and leaf eating insects in general use four pounds to fifty gallons of water as soon as the insects appear. Repeat on later broods if needed. Arsen-

ate of lead is deadly to human beings and must be used with care. Fruit and vegetables that have been sprayed must be thoroughly washed before they are used.
