

Walls for Main Street

At a meeting of the board of works last night, the engineer recommended that the specifications for permanent paying in Main street be amended so as to allow the contractor to put in concrete retaining walls instead of dry stone walls. It was agreed to sustain this recommendation. The engineer said that the concreté wall would be about two-thirds the thickness of the stone wall and would cost no more. He announced that the oil to be used in the experiment of laying the dust in the streets had arrived in the city. As soon as the surface of Douglas avenue dried it would be applied. A committee was appointed to interview the superintendent of the street railway to find out if the company would undertake to water the streets in which their rails are laid.
