

TEACHER OF NEW CULT. ARRESTED

Chicago, Jan. 12--Evelyn Arthur See, self-declared apostle of a new life, in which all things will be perfect, appeared in the municipal court here to answer to charges of disorderly conduct. Two girls, one 19 and the other 17 years old, who admitted in court they had for months been living with See, unchaperoned, also appeared under the same charges. Mona Rees, the elder of the girls, was destined, according to the plan of See, to be mother of the first "nearly perfect" child, she herself being almost perfect, according to the cult's teachings. The other girl, Mildred Bridges, was striving to attain that state of purity, she declared, that would place her on a plane with the Rees girl.

Twenty thirty little boys and girls attended a sort of school conducted by these three, and according to See, were taught to be useful, and to work for the love of work, not for money alone. 
