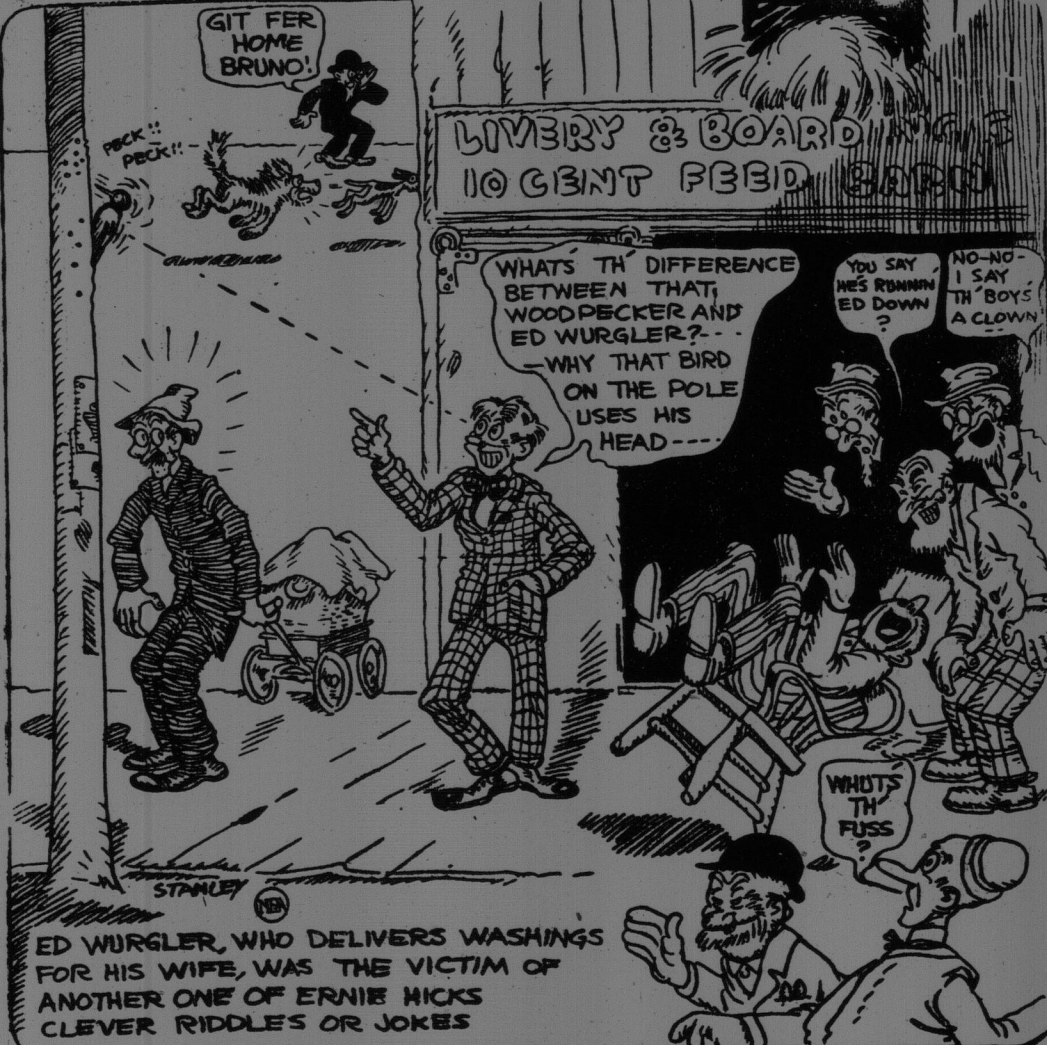

Consider Your Mouth

Whenever little Johnny became too talkative, Mr. Mann of Anytown would refer to him as "too mouthy." However, Mr. Mann was a bit talkative himself. So Johnny, like his father, came to associate the mouth with talking, and with nothing else. Now talking is not, and never was, the primary function of the mouth. Long before men conversed, they ate. Food must tarry and be worked before it starts on its journey to the stomach. If the tongue were shown under a magnifying glass it would be found to have "taste buds," by which the various pleasant and unpleasant flavors are tested.

And there should be good, sound teeth for the proper mastication. Then enters saliva which, when given a proper chance to act, brings important chemical changes. Thus the starch of bread is changed to a kind of sugar called maltose. Food containing starch needs an abundant overflow of the salivary glands, and must remain in the mouth sufficiently long to give the saliva a chance to freely mingle with each portion of it. The work of digesting food depends largely upon the preparation given by the mouth. The moral is obvious: Use your mouth for something besides talking.



Loneliest Outpost In All the World

Leningrad, April 23.—What is said to be the most lonely outpost in the world for human beings has been set up at Karsk, on the Kara Sea, an arm of the Arctic, in the form of a wireless and hydro-meteorological station. The Kara sea is blocked by ice the greater part of the year, being passable for ships during only a few weeks in summer. The Academy of Sciences in Leningrad announced recently that four smaller stations also had been established on the Kara sea by the Soviet government, each of these being joined with a hydro-meteorological bureau. The wireless station at Karsk keeps in touch with vessels in Polar waters and sends out weather forecasts regularly. There are but two men at the station and, because of the ice and weather conditions it is not able to send them supplies only once every year. The chief recreation of the meteorologists and wireless operators is hunting and fishing.

The U. S. Biological Survey has sent an expedition into Central America to capture specimens of the beautiful Honduras spotted turkey.

New York — Three-year-old John Sultan is more than 7,000 miles from home and parents. But he's no cry baby. He's a gorilla baby and he has come to the United States to show that gorilla babies are superior to human. So he doesn't cry or sinner, though often he grows lonesome for his family in the jungle of the upper Congo. But Miss Alyce Cunningham of London is his foster-mother, and he snuggles up close to her when the noise of the American greeting scares him. When she's around he's afraid of nothing. He stands by all day long, feeding him in the morning, watching him during the day, and rocking him to sleep at night. For John is now her greatest treasure. His uncle, John Daniel, once was, but she sold him to a circus, and then he died of a broken heart. So now she says she will never leave John the 2nd.

Scientists say she has some job on her hands. For gorillas die when taken away from their jungle-land. No one had ever been able to keep one alive, until Miss Cunningham captured the first John. But even he didn't last long. He's now standing stuffed in a case in the Museum of Natural History. So far she has had good luck with John the 2nd. She has brought him up the past nine months, ever since he was captured by some hunters in French West Africa. For a time she kept him in her apartment in London. Then he decided to bring him to America. The best suite on board a first class liner was engaged for her John. At the pier a \$20,000 automobile met him and took him to one of New York's finest hotels, where four rooms had been reserved. At the circus where John is exhibited during working hours, a special glass compartment has been constructed. On one side is a balcony with John's bed screened off from observation. A special heating apparatus has been installed to make him comfortable. A special cook prepares his meals. A special physician looks after his health. But John is no spoiled child, despite all these attentions.

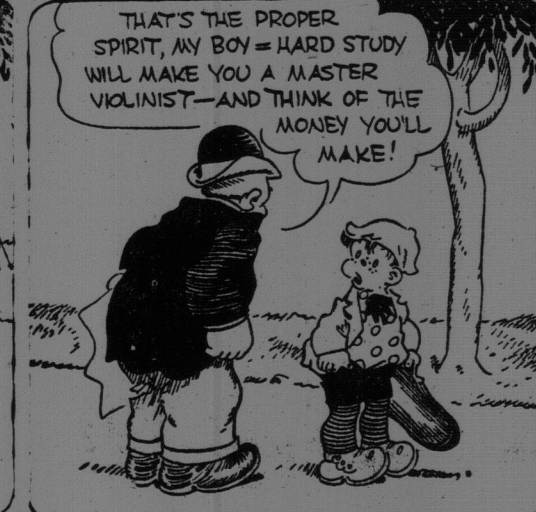

ANGLICANS PLAN FOR TWO SYNODS

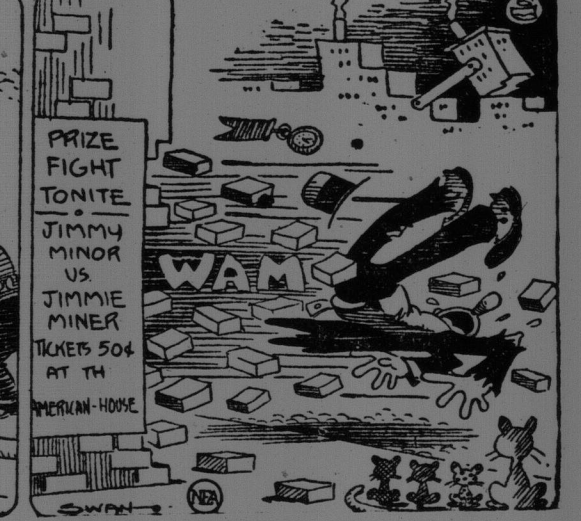

IN TERRIBLE PLIGHT IN EAST, THEY SAY

Rev. A. E. Kochaly, of the Armenian Relief, received a cable yesterday from the Near East Relief in Greece telling of terrible conditions there. The message read, "Food, clothing, shelter, sanitary measures critical." A letter received by Rev. Mr. Kochaly from Dr. Paul Monroe in the Near East, says: "There is the greatest need we have seen in any country since the great war. There are 600,000 refugees in Macedonia and scores of them, mostly women and children, are undernourished and suffering from malaria. They are living in indescribable conditions of unsanitary barracks, shacks and hovels, huddled together for lack of better shelter."

Another cable came a few days ago and stated that the "Food our children of the orphanages ate this morning has not been paid for."

John R. Mott sends out the warning that 100,000 more refugees are expected to arrive in Greece before June. He says that the situation of the people in Salonica is admitted to be past description. George F. White, of the American Board of Missions, says that there are one third of a million people starving to death.

QUEBEC BATTALION MAY BE REDUCED

Quebec, April 22.—A report from a semi-official source reaching here from Ottawa has it that the strength of the 22nd Battalion stationed at the Citadel is to be reduced within two months. At present the unit has an effective strength of 165 men. This number will, it is understood, be decreased to 100. Other permanent units will be affected in the same proportion by the same decision, it is said.
