FILE REFERENCES RE: DAVIS MASON - murder (263), Union Lake District, Sask. (UNION LAKE DETACHMENT CASE)

HEADQUARTERS: Further to my report of the 10th inst., in the above connection, patrol was made on the PM that same date per hired team and cutter to the Union Lake Indian reserve, as a result the following articles of clothing came into my possession: (a) Blouse, sleeve-less, blue and pink stripes. (b) shirt, plaid (red/green/blue check). (c) Under-skirt, dk blue small red/white pattern. (d) one pr cotton stockings, black. 2. These articles I have identified as clothes worn by deceased Mrs. MASON when I saw her at the house of Philip PANTAYAN on the Union Lake Indian reserve, Sask., on the night of November 30th last. The clothes had been removed by the natives after the death of Mrs. MASON, and had been unknown to me, and was apparently done after the coroner's inquest and before the body was taken to the agency office pending autopsy. 3. All articles of clothing, show stains which in my opinion are blood stains, and numerous cuts are evident. These items have been marked for identification purposes, and are being held at this detachment exhibit no. 69. Forms 346 attached hereto. COMMITTED FOR TRIAL. S.P. 263-2-93
