GOFF of letter No. 5 by the Commander-in-Chief on Non-Fredernization

"To: All Members of the British Forces in Germany.

Great progress has been made in the de-Mezification of the British Sone and in removing Nezis from all responsibility in degman life. Further, the Germans have shown themselves willing to obey my orders and to coperate in the reconstruction of their country on Non-west lines.

I have already modified my orders about non-graternization and allowed you to speak and play with little children. I now consider it desirable and little children. I now consider it desirable and timely to permit a further modification of these rules. tou may now engage in conversation with adult Germans you may now engage in conversation with adult Germans

You will not for the present enter the homes and houses of the Garmans nor parmit them to enter any of the premises you are using except for duty or work.

I know the non-fraternization policy has been a strain upon many of you who have to live and work in close contact with Germans, and I appreciate the loyal way in which you have honoured it.
