An Optimistic View of Present Unemployment

TORONTO.—In its March letter, the Royal Bank of Candal looks for an improvement in the unemployment situation in Canada and takes a generally optimistic view of present conditions in this country.

Conservative estimates, says the letter, place the number of workers in the United States who are at present unemployed at about 3,000,000, while, up to the end of January, figures compiled for Great Britain thow that 1,060,000 laborers were out of employment.
