

LONDON PRESS PRAISES WORK OF CANADIANS

REV. H. D. MARR NO SHORTAGE OF ROAD MONEY CALL TO CH.

Telegraph's Story Regarding York County a Pure Fake Published for Election Purposes

(The Gleaner, July 17) The Telegraph will continue to publish its fancy tales and fake stories about the want of money for work on the roads, and today it has something of this kind to say with reference to York County. On inquiry to Secretary Gleaner that the counties this year have two years' road money to their credit and are better off than ever before.

Under the Act of 1904 road taxes had to be paid in cash and when collected was paid to the secretary-treasurer of county, but not one dollar of it was spent during the year it was collected. The Act required that on March 1 in each year secretary-treasurer should give the department of public works a statement showing the amount of road money for the year of each parish, and after the 1st of March that department issued a draft in favor of the road superintendent of each parish for the amount to its credit. The money to be spent this year was collected last year. So far Highway Board of the county this year by the secretary-treasurer, being the taxes collected last year, in which under the existing law, will be immediately available, will also be used by the boards.

That no money has as yet been received from the Government is due to the fact that there has not as yet been any shortfalls, and the boards have two years' money to go on with.

Tiger Whips Lion. Two Fight in Ring at a Coney Island Show—Spectators a Venge of Panic and Several Women Faint.

New York, July 19.—While 1500 persons looked on in amazement, a lion and tiger of the Bostock animal show, at Coney Island, started fighting at 10 o'clock this afternoon and before they could be separated the hind-quarters of the lion had been so mangled by his striped competitor, from Bengal that he probably will have to be shot.

The shooting of revolvers by trainers and attendants, terrified spectators, and there came very near being a panic. Several women fainted. One became hysterical and Dr. Smith and two nurses from the emergency hospital had to be sent for before she could be calmed.
