Mr. Justice McKeown occupied the chair and on the platform with him were Hon, W. E. Foster, Mayor Hayes, Lieut.-Col. Powell, and a number of citizens.

The chairman in a few words outlined the reason for the calling of the meeting and introduced the first speak, Capt. Dingle who has just returned from France.

Capt. Dingle in a short address told of the work of the Y. M. C. A. among the boys more particularly at the front. He said if there was any shortage at any time the fellows in billet had to do without until the boys in the trenches were served and that an effort was made to keep a full line of the things the boys wanted in the canteens all the time.

They have at the present time twenty-two places behind the front line trenches at which more than 150,000 cups of coffee, tea and cocoa are given away every day. He also told of a little tin shack near Viny Ridge at which in one twenty-food cups of hot drinks to men coming out and going in. In the month of February last over 600,000 men were served at the canteens with out a single cent of exepnse to one of them.
