The work of the Liberation Society in England is still carried on with great energy. Two conferences were recently held, at Newcastle-on-Tyne and at Sunderland. Sir Henry Havelock, M. P., spoke at both. At Sunderland he accounted for his sudden change of opinion by saying that the Church Congress at Brighton, which he had attended, had convinced him of the impossibility of church reform except through disestablishment. Mr. Gordon, the lectur r of the society, is speaking in many of the towns of England. Dr. Fraser, Bishop of Manchester, recently delivered an address on the Liberation Society which has called forth a reply from the Rev. J. G. Rogers, President of the Congregational Union of England.
