## HUNDREDS OF LIVES LOST IN ONTARIO FOREST FIRES

Englehart, Ont., July 30 Forest fires, which for son Forest fires, which for some days have threatened the northernmost towns and the outlying settlements of Northern Ontario yesterday and today culminated in a holocaust which has wiped out entire communities, licked the fringe of large towns and levied a death roll which cannot at present be accurately computed, but which will range from 140 to 200. Scores of persons are suffering from injuries, many of whom are likely to succumb.

Toronto, July 31—A message received by the Department of Mines and Forests at the Parliament buildings states that the fires in Northern Ontario have been entirely quenched by heavy rains. All of the fires are out.
