Fournier, the sitting mem., but defeated at g. e., 1875. Elected for Portneuf at g. e., 1878, but an unsuccessful candidate at g. e., 1881. First returned to the Commons. for Megantic, 10 July, 1884, on the sitting mem. being unseated by the Court. Elected for present seat at g. e., 1887, 1891 and 1896. A Liberal.—Quebec.

S. of James Lang, and Agnes Stewart, natives of Renfrewshire, Scot., who emigrated to Can. in 1832 and 1820, respectively. B. in the Village of Sheene, 10 April, 1839, and ed. in the Common School there. M., 9 Nov., 1866. Elizabeth Shearer. Is a farmer. Apptd. a J.P. in 1868. Sat in the Ontabee Tp. Co. for 16 years, and in the County Co. for 13 years, as Reeve and Deputy Reeve, and was Warden of his County in 1884. First returned to Parit. at g. e., 1887. Was not a candidate at g. e., 1891. Re-elected at g. e., 1896. An Independent Liberal,—Jermyn, Ont.
