That the said Report be adopted, and the Bill read a third time presently,

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was, on a Division, resolved in the affirmative

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

The same was, on a division, resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that Heuse that the Senate have passed this Bill to which they desire their concurrence.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Hon. Mr. Mitchell, it was Kesoived, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to communicate to that House the evidence and copy of the exhibits attached thereto, reported to this House by the Committee to which was referred the Bill intituled: "An Act for the relief of John Il race "Stevenson," together with the exemplification of the Judgment of the Court of Queen's Bench, in the case of the Queen against Robiin, produced to this House on the presentation of the petition to bring in the said Bill.

Orde ed, That one of the Masters in Chancery do carry the said Message to the House

of Commons.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to further amend the "Charter of the Gore Bank" was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable Mr. Campbell, it was

Ordered, 'I hat the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Banking and Commerce.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the Act of "incorporation of the Board of Trade of the City of Toronto," was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable Mr.

Campbell, it was

'Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Banking and Commerce. '

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to increase the "Capital Stock of the Clifton Suspension Bridge Company," was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable

Mr. Campbell, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Standing Orders and Private Bills.

Then on motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Hon. Campbell.

The House adjourned until Friday next, at half-past seven o'clock, in the evening.
