clauses, provisions, powers, authorities, directions and regulations in the said Acts severally contained, shall be, and the same is and are hereby continued in full force and effect until the day of which will be in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that in case the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, shall think fit to distribute to the several bodies or battalions of Militia, in this Province, a quantity of Fire-locks or Muskets, with Pouches and other accourrements, not exceeding for every Division or Battalion, such Fire-locks or Muskets, and the Pouches shall be entrusted to the care of the Officer Commanding the Division or Battalion.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that in case the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person Administering the Government, for the time being, should think fit to distribute to each Commanding Officer of a Division or Battalion, any Ball-Cartridges, it shall be the duty of such Commanding Officer, on the drill days, by Law appointed, to cause the Militia-men, between the ages of eighteen and thirty, to fire at a Mark; which cartridges shall be paid for by the public money of this Province, out of the un-appropriated monies.—Provided the number of the said Cartridges do not exceed

Division or Battalion.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be lawful for the Officers commanding the said Divisions, or Battalions, who shall have received such Firelocks or Muskets and Pouches to place them in a place of deposit, and to give them in charge to such persons as they may think fit, near the places fixed for assembling their Divisions or Battalions or the Companies thereof.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that to enable the said Officers Commanding Divisions or Battalions to cause the said Firelocksor Muskets and Pouches to be taken proper care of and cleaned and repaired when necessary, the sum of for each Musket shall be allowed them annually.
