C A P. LXVIII.

An Act for making perpetual and amending several Laws for encouraging the making of Sail Cloth in *Great Britain*, and securing the Duties on Foreign Sail Cloth imported; and for making perpetual several Laws for permitting the Exportation of a certain Quantity of Corn and Grain to *Guernsey*, *Jersey*, and *Alderney*; and for regulating the Fees of Officers of the Customs, and of Naval Officers in the *British Colonies in America*, and of the Officers of the Customs in *Newfoundland*.

WHEREAS the several Laws and Parts of Laws herein-after mentioned have been found beneficial and are near expiring; and it is expedient that the same should be made perpetual; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That so much and such Parts of an Act made in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen *Anne*, intituled, *An Act for the better Encouragement of the making of Sail Cloth in Great Britain*; and which was to continue in force for Seven Years, and from thence until the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which was further
