Hockey Yeomen trounce the Golden Gaels

York's undefeated hockey Yeomen opened their month long home stand in brutal fashion last Saturday, as they trounced the Queen's Golden Gaels 11-1 in the Ice Palace.

York opened up the game playing in an erratic style not typical of the team. They were having problems in their passing and skating and were being carefully watched by the Gaels. With just seven minutes gone in the game, Ned McIntyre deflected a long shot from the point through a crowd and past York netminder Peter Kostek.

But that was all that she wrote for the Gaels as the Yeomen put 11 straight goals past Andy Schell in the Queen's net. It didn't take long for York to tie up the game with a goal from John Goodish from a Bob Wasson rebound.

In the second period the Yeomen came to life as the Gaels slowed down their play possibly due to fatigue from a game the night before against Western. The Yeomen unleashed a relentless attack of some twenty shots at the Queen's cage scoring four times in the period.

Pointgetters for York were Ron Hawkshaw with his first of two, John Goodish's with his second and Dave Chalk with his first of two on the day. Jim Masin put in his first of three after a mad scramble in front of the net.

In the third period there was little hope for the Gaels as the Yeomen just continued with their attack. By now the Queen's squad was starting to take cheap shots at the Yeomen, but to no avail as the team notched six more goals to up the score to 11-1. Throughout the game it was evident that the Yeomen were not being lulled to sleep by the play of Queen's. They continued to make all of their passing plays click and worked on their power play and penalty killing. In that third period, just about everyone on the team got a chance to play every position. Late in the period, coach Chambers juggled his lines to give everyone a chance to play with everyone.

Counting goals for York in the third period were Bob Wasson on a

tip-in from Chris Meloff, Jim Masin scored a pair, one on a door step pass from Romano Carlucci, the other he scored alone while being pulled down from behind.

Ron Hawkshaw also scored his second.

Late in the period with all of the York players in the Queen's zone, Rodger Dorey notched one as he moved in from his defense position. Ending the scoring was Dave Chalk who was moved up to a forward spot where he showed his prowess scoring on a breakaway feed from Romano Carlucci.

Turning to the other end of the ice, Peter Kostek had a relatively easy time of it. He faced only 22 shots and was really tested on only a few of those. This was due to the fact that Coach Chambers is now dressing six defensemen and only nine forwards. This means that with the addition of Chris Meloff, one of the forwards now misses a regular shift in the lineup.

Badminton team win first place at RMC

York's Badminton Yeoman won 20 out of 24 matches to capture the team title at the RMC Open held in Kingston, last Saturday.

York led the field in a tournament consisting of five teams, U. of T. finished second followed by Queens, RMC and Ryerson.

Gienek Kszakiewicz, former Canadian Junior Doubles champion, led the team as it captured three individual victories in the singles events against stiff competition from U of T.

The Yeomen's plans to sweep the one day tournament were upset when U of T's doubles teams fought back to gain both doubles titles.

The York team promises to be in the thick of a rugged three-way battle for the OUAA championship with U of T.

The effects of a vigorous daily training program were apparent as York waged a war of attrition to dominate the singles event. In first

seed position, York's Gienek Kszakiewicz was the victor in the finals with U of T, these results were duplicated as York's second seed, Joe Jong, and third seed, Barry Ramsay, defeated U of T players to win individual trophies.

York dropped to second place in the fourth seed where Michael Christ allowed U of T to gain a slender three point victory in the final game.

In doubles play, the University of Toronto team of Hinchcliff and

Cozzarini defeated the York team of Gienek and Christ to win the first seed doubles competition. The York second seed team of Ramsay and Jong finished third, with the U of T team of Ball and Rosenthal finishing first.

Yeowomen swimmers upset McMaster

Yeowomen swimmers saved their best performance of the season for the home fans when they upset the McMaster Marauders 67-49 in a dual meet at Tait McKenzie last Wednesday evening.

Prior to the meet, coach Carol Gluppe commented, "On paper we can win the meet by three points, if everyone performs well."

The surprising 18 point margin was attained as Yeowomen divers Martha Halenda and Lisa Beverley put in outstanding performances, placing first and second in the one-metre board competition. The divers managed to contribute a

total of 13 points to the Yeowomen victory as Martha Halenda repeated her winning form on the three-metre board.

Once again Chris Lovett-Doust led the way for the women swimmers breaking varsity records in the 200-metre individual medley and the 400-metre freestyle.

Liz McGregor won the gruelling 800-metre freestyle while Candy Millar and Anne Westall chalked up victories in their specialties, the 200 metre free and 100 metre butterfly respectively.

With what coach Byron MacDonald called a "weak lineup"

the Yeomen easily defeated the McMaster squad 73-33.

"I gave the men the choice to race in off events for a psychological change and as a result we swam a weaker line-up than we could have," says MacDonald. "It gave me a chance to see men like Cam Rothery, George Trenton, and Gabor Mezo perform out of the shadow of our normal workhorses."

The three Yeomen each won their events. Neil Harvey continued his record-breaking swimming as he set one new pool record and two new varsity records, one by over 50 seconds.
