## Arrows face Russia's Traktor

The Russians are coming. The Russians are coming.

Traktor Cheljabinsk, third place finishers in the Soviet First Division will skate their famous circles around Mississauga Golden Arrows of the OHA Senior A hockey league tomorrow.

The Traktor - Arrow contest at Port Credit Arena could prove to be the most exciting game of hockey involving a senior A club in Mississauga this season.

It could also prove to be an acute embarrassment for the Arrows — losers in 17 of their first 20 games — if the Russians are as strong as Arrow officials make them out to be.

"They finished high in their division last year and won the playoffs," says Arrow coach Hal Schooley. "They are the top club in Russia and have some of the national team members of the future in their lineup. I expect that four or five of

A total of 11 Mississauga athletes have been recognized by Sport Canada as part of their Game Plan program.

The athletes were categorized as A cardholders which are athletes ranked in the top eight in the world in individual events or members of teams ranked in the top four; B cardholders, those individuals ranked from ninth to 18th or members of teams ranked from fifth to eighth or national cardholders for those not yet internationally ranked but showing great potential at the national level.

The categorizations determine the amount of grants.

Paddler John Wood and soling skipper Hans Fogh are A cardholders. Gregg Smith who combined with Wood to take home a silver medal from Bulgaria in the world canoe championships last summer, is the only B athlete.

Four members of the Mississauga Canoe Club are recognized as national cardholders. They are Jeremy Abbott, Martin Fraser and brothers Dean and Reid Oldershaw.

Sally Dakin has been determined a national cardholder, for her badminton skills. Bruce and Dan Rogers were the only Mississauga swimmers noted.

Sprinter Cole Doty, who toured Europe with the Canadian team last summer, is the only Mississauga athlete in the track and field division.

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga on the 19th day of December, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as The Copeland House, 1050 Burnhamthorpe Road East, Part of Lot 3 Concession 1, N.D.S., as a property of historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

**SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:**

Copeland House is recommended for designation on the architectural grounds that it is a well-preserved and attractive example of a vernacular Georgian house. Built of Credit Valley stone, it also represents a building material once common but now rare. Historically, it is an interesting example of a settler's "second house", the solid more comfortable house that a family would build once they had established themselves successfully on the land. Believed to have been built in the 1820's by Thomas Copeland, it is one of the oldest houses still standing in Mississauga today. The fact that it remained in the hands of the Copeland family for more than a century provides additional interest.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of December 28, 1977.
