In 1595 the Dutch at last sent 4 ships by way of Cape These returned with good news but small cargo. but may seemed so distant so that next year as late as 1596 Dutch made 3rd attempt at north east passage

For the main facts in ^{extant} history of East Indies. limiting ourselves to 1st period in history of East Indies Co. ¹⁵⁸⁵ From ^{first} ^{beginning} ^{for our purpose} of operation of East Ind. Co. 1600 down to abandonment of direct trade with Spice Is about 1685, On this subj. Jas. Mill's history is still unsurpassed. (give some time to this) Mill as we might suppose throughout shows an extremely individualistic laisser faire attitude. He takes an anti attitude as against fort control or monopoly - we can make allowance for that.

Of late yrs the earliest records of East Indies Co have begun to be printed, full of interest for thought & condition of early part of 17th C. The two first of these, tho published by diff publishers are marked by use of a diff title on back of book from that on title page.
