



Dear Mr. Meighen:-

Acknowledging yours of the 22nd addressed to the Premier. After the strenuous work of the Session Mr. Rhodes was a bit washed out physically, and this morning he left for New York where he will receive medical treatment, returning to Halifax Friday, April 2nd. He has made reservations, and plans to sail from Halifax for England on the 4th. Mrs. Rhodes and his daughter will join him there.

Some of the Members here were very strongly of the opinion that a resolution should have been introduced in the House of Assembly regarding the disclosure of confidential information by Premier King. Mr. Rhodes, however, was inclined to the view that no useful purpose would be served, as the people at large would fail to realize the magnitude of the impropriety, and so no resolution was submitted.
