Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 12<sup>th</sup> instant, respecting the accounts of creditors of the Six Nations; and to inform you that from what you say it would appear that out of the sum of \$18109<sup>63</sup> deducted by you from the annuities of the Indians up to the fall of 1883, you have only paid, and that to one creditor \$8500<sup>36</sup>, leaving still in your hands \$9609<sup>27</sup> unaccounted for.

You will at once explain where this balance has been lying, and what interest has accumulated thereon.
