One of the results of the entry into effect of the treaties will be the withdrawal of occupation forces from the ex-eneny satellite states, subject to the right of the Soviet Union to keep sufficient forces in Roumania and Hungary to maintain lines of communication with its occupation some in Austria.

It is provided in the preambles to these treaties that their conclusion will enable the Allied and Associated Powers to support the application of each of the enemy states concerned for membership in the United Nations. If these states eventually become members of the United Nations they will be able to participate in common action on international problems through the United Nations. Eventual applications for membership from these states will, of course, be judged by the Canadian Government on their

merits and in the light of existing circumstances.

Becuase of the advantages which would derive from a termination of the state of war with these states, it appears desirable that parliamentary approval should
