for the timber being £15 per standard of Archangel Reds No. 3. In return the United Kingdom agrees to furnish tin and rubber to an equivalent value, the price for each commodity being specified in the agreement. The provisions governing the carriage of the goods do not appear to present any feature of special interest to the Canadian Government. One purpose of the agreement from the United Kingdom side was to secure the release of the shipping involved.


